#### Broad Policy Successes

Led effort to form Mississippi River Caucus

Wrote and led passage, funding of fthe STORM Act

 Led effort to enact a full-river ecosystem program

Restored Marine Hwy Grant Prog from \$0 to nearly \$80 million

Worked to secure whole river as a Critical Conservation Area

## City Project Successes

- \$8 million in IRA funds for the Quad Cities region;
- \$1 million for community center upgrades, East St. Louis, IL;
- \$500k for broadband connectivity, Alton, IL
- \$350k for Disaster Resilience and Response, Newport, MN;
- \$2 million for downtown commercial corridor, Greenville, MS
- \$4 million for waterfront corridor Memphis, TN;
- Deployed the Corridor's first Environmental Impact Bonds for Memphis and New Orleans
